"THE charity was launched on St David's day in 2001 and initially operated with just one helicopter which was based in Swansea. We now operate 3 helicopters which are based in Swansea, Caernarvon and Welshpool. Each crew has one pilot and two advanced life support paramedics who are trained in the latest techniques in pre hospital emergency care ensure the patient receives the most effective treatment.

"The helicopters can be launched within 3 minutes of receiving an emergency call and

example, a flight from Pembrokeshire to Morriston Hospital usually takes just 20 minutes. Think how long the same journey would take by road!

"Pembrokeshire is served by the Swansea based helicopter and our bright red helicopter is a frequent sight around the county, especially during the summer months. The rural nature of Pembrokeshire combined with the oil and gas industries mean that the Air Ambulance has come to be seen as an essential emergency service in the county.

"Since it was formed, the emergency teams of Wales Air Ambulance have flown over 14.000 missions. In the summer months, each helicopter will fly on average 3 to 4 times per day during the week and 7-8 times per day at the weekends. 2011 is proving to be our busiest year ever and this level of work places a strain on our budget with each mission costing £1,500 on average.

"All of our work relies upon public generosity. The cost of operating this air ambulance service is approximately £5million per annum. This money is raised through charitable donations, fundraising events, and membership of our lifesaving lottery. For this reason, That'll Be The Day! is a vitally important fundraising event for us."

Wales Air Ambulance and the RNLI

THE RNLI ON THE **PEMBROKESHIRE COAST**

THE coastal waters of Pembrokeshire have been provided with an RNLI rescue service since 1822 when a station was set up in Fishguard.

Lifeboat stations were then established along the coast over the next 46 years and the service has grown to what it is today. The RNLI provides a nationwide coastal rescue service and protects inland waterways too. The RNLI now has an active fleet of 300 lifeboats based at 235 lifeboat stations around the coast of UK and Northern Ireland.

The boats are manned by highly trained cox and crews from all walks of life, very special people who risk their lives to save others.

The organisation is funded by the income from charitable events arranged by volunteers and by donations and legacies. The support of business people and the public in Pembrokeshire is outstanding. In 2006, the Tamar class lifeboat - the most advanced in the world - the RNLB The Haydn Miller was launched in



Tenby, totally funded by the legacy of the late Haydn Gustav Miller. In 2009, the second Tamar class lifeboat in the county was launched at Angle, by Prince Michael of Kent, the grand master of the Grand Lodge Of Mark Masons, named the RNLB 'Mark Mason'. Pembrokeshire people and Angle lifeboat supporters from Birmingham made important financial contributions to the purchase of the lifeboat, with the final £1.6 million being given by the Grand Lodge of Mark Master

Masons. It is a great achievement to have acquired two Tamar Class lifeboats in Pembrokeshire — the first two in Wales.

Supporters must take credit for this and to know that future funds raised help the RNLI'S research and development into new boats.

This year there are over 65 lifeguards covering 13 beaches in Pembrokeshire. In Wales Lifeguards patrol a total of 28

The cost of running the RNLI is £378,000 per day and this is only made possible by loyal supporters and fundraising members of branches and Lifeboat guilds in Pembrokeshire and beyond, for which the RNLI is extremely grateful.
