Call to bring back event

Haverfordwest's mayor is determined to reinstate the town's annual fair despite problems finding a venue.

There was no fair in May and it appears unlikely that a new site will be found before October's annual fair, after last year's event left Picton Playing fields churned up.

Councillor Jim Campbell said that the fair is an important tradition of the town and should be reinstated.

"I believe with the present attitude of the county council we are going to lose

another part of the history of our town.

"There has been a fair in Haverfordwest for more than 100 years and I feel the Showmen's Guild has been treated very badly," he added.

Cllr Campbell feels that the fair could be returned to St Thomas Green or be held on Rifleman Field.

"There is no reason it cannot go back to St Thomas Green, a lot of people will object there but it has been there for many years. Rifleman Field would be better, it is away from most of the houses.

"The council suggestion of Withybush and behind

Halfords have been turned down by the Guild on several occasions. Withybush is too far out of town and it is a very hazardous route for young people to walk out there.

"I will continue to campaign for restoration of the fair so that next year for the 900 year celebrations we will

have the fair back," said Cllr Campbell.

A spokesman for Pembrokeshire County Council said: "It is not the authority's responsibility to find a site for the fair but we have suggested possible sites — including the County Showground — to the Showmen's Guild and it

is up to them to pursue those suggestions.

"Neither Rifleman Field nor St Thomas's Green are suitable to host the fair.

"This information has been relayed to the Showmen's Guild in meetings with the authority and the Guild appears to have accepted the position."
